THE MISMATCH ILLUSION 2 Kings 6:14

They just had the battle of the Little BigHorn again. Custer lost this time too. Actually it was part of a movie on the life of the great Oglala Lakota, Chief Crazy Horse. Of course, the big scene was the portrayal of Custer's last stand.

Now, one challenge for the warrior Indian riders (the actors) was riding bareback; they had to do that full speed in the battle scenes. It looks as if there are hundreds of warrior Indian riders because the warriors were going by so fast in a cloud of dust. One might ask, How many warriors did they need to reenact a battle that involved so many Indians? The answer, About eighty. Hollywood of course, is all about illusion, so they just had these eighty guys charge up to the soldiers, turn their horses sharply and circle around again and again and again. There were not nearly as many warriors on the other side as it looked like in the movie. Custer might have wished that the real odds might had been that even.

Well, I want to have A WORD WITH YOU this month about THE MISMATCH ILLUSION.

Our word for this month from the Word of God comes from 2 Kings 6:14. The King of Syria really wants Elisha captured: "The King sent an entire army to get the prophet, he sent horses and chariots and a strong force and at night they surrounded the city. When the servant of the man of God got up and went out early the next morning he saw the army and horses and chariots that surrounded the city. 'Oh my Lord Elisha, what shall we do?', the servant asked. 'Don't be afraid,' the prophet Elisha answered. 'Those who are with us are more than those who are with them.'" At that moment the eyes of Elisha's servant were opened and he could see the unseen army of the Lord as well, which encircled the army of the Syrian King.

The opposing forces looked overwhelming - they weren't. Rather than being overwhelming to Elisha and his servant, the Syrian army was actually overwhelmed! As the story continues to unfold, the armies of the Living God protect the Servant of God. Which God always does.

Based on the armed forces Elisha's servant could see, he reacted with anxiety and fear. It looked like a total mismatch, but the mismatch was an illusion! Kind of like the movie portrayal of Custer's last stand. The attackers looked much stronger than they really were. When you get all the information about who is out there, it doesn't seem nearly as intimidating.

Right now maybe you are in a battle where it looks like a lop-sided mismatch with you being overwhelmed by the opposition, by the darkness that's attacking, by the responsibilities pressing in. The tendency is to retreat, to give up, go hide, compromise. Maybe you are worried about the bad influences on your son or daughter and what they might become, or about some strong opposition to a work you are trying to do for the Lord, or the financial odds threatening to consume you. Maybe it's the pressure that has intimidated you into silence where you should be sharing and speaking out. Whatever it is, what stands in the way looks huge! But, you need to look again at this battle, this time to the forces of Jesus - committed to the battle on your behalf.

Listen to Adonai's (the LORD's) promises, "The One who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world." 1 John 4:4.

"A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but he (the destroyer, see John 10:10) will not come near you." Psalm 91:7.

"The chariots of God are tens of thousands, and thousands of thousands, the Lord has come." Psalm 68:17.

"If God be for us, who could be against us?" Romans 8:31.

Hey, you have been intimidated long enough, you have played defense long enough, you have sunk back in fear long enough, "God has not given us a spirit of fear," the Bible says, "but of power and love and a sound mind." 2 Timothy 1:7.

The enemy isn't nearly as big or as strong as they might want you to believe. The enemy's plan is to use illusion to hold you back, to put you down, or to keep you in your place. The Good-News: you have in you the risen Christ who said "all authority has been given to Me in Heaven and on earth." Matthew 28:18. You have all the power of Jesus' blood and Jesus' name. True the devil keeps circling, like those Indian riders in the movie reenactment, to make you think you are outnumbered, and you are, but this battle shall be decided by the awesome forces of your Living God. And, just as Elisha stated, "Those who are with us are more than those who are with them."





Come Break Bread with Us ~ Fellowship and Lent Study

Please plan to join our Lenten soup and Bible study Wednesday evenings, beginning

February 21 through March 27, from 5 to 7:00 P.M. in the Haddad Fellowship Center.

Following a meal of soup and bread, Pastor Nathan Wheeler will lead a Lenten lesson based on the book *The Third Day, by Rev, Tom Berlin*. In *The Third Day,* the *Rev. Tom Berlin* explores the way that the resurrection of Jesus Christ profoundly changed the lives of those who followed Him and how it can transform our lives as well. Because Jesus was resurrected on the third day, we know that God offers new beginnings regardless of what the facts of our present reality may seem to be telling us. Jesus' resurrection offers us hope and the assurance that God is present not only in our brightest moments, but also in our darkest hours.

The Third Day explores this Good News of Jesus' resurrection through the stories of several of His followers—Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter, Thomas, the disciples at Emmaus, and the apostle Paul. A final chapter offers a summary of the purpose of the Resurrection utilizing Jesus' own predictions and observations about the miracle of the third day.



Mission Update- Bethlehem Ministries

In the 1980's, Father Bruno was a young priest in charge of a church in Cap-Haitien, Haiti's second largest city. Led by his conviction that education is **KEY** to helping his country change its social and economic situation, he had built a primary school, an elementary, vocational and an agricultural school for young men and women. His lifelong dream was to return to his father's beloved rural home of Terrier Rouge in northern Haiti and build an elementary and secondary school there. He held that prayer in his heart having faith that God would provide a way.

In 1985, a recent college graduate, Clai Rice, was introduced to Father Bruno and asked if he could come to Haiti and teach in one of his schools there. He encouraged his family to join him in Haiti to meet Father Bruno and hear of his mission to improve the lives of Haitians through education. This mission became the inspiration for Bethlehem Ministry, Inc., the U.S.-based nonprofit started by the Rices and created to support Father Bruno's vision. The name Bethlehem Ministry was chosen by Father Bruno because, "Bethlehem means House of Bread and we are going to be about feeding the poor and hungry. We want to offer the Spiritual Bread to everyone who crosses our path."



For over 30 years, Bethlehem Ministry has worked hard to do just that, raising funds to support Father Bruno's mission of feeding, educating, and sharing the Gospel of Christ in service to the poor of northern Haiti. In 2002, Father Bruno's prayer to build a school in Terrier Rouge was answered. St. Barthélémy School welcomed its first class of preschoolers that year, and it grew alongside those children, expanding over the years, eventually reaching completion with the building of the high school in 2012. Today over 1,200 students are educated, fed, and nurtured at St. Bart's each school year. The education they receive includes music, sports, language, and philosophy. In 2008, the Jatrofa Projenou (JP), was developed to reduce rural poverty in Haiti through sustainable economic development, forestry, and farming. Bethlehem Ministry supports

the work of Jatrofa Projenou because it is in keeping with their mission that the empowerment of the Haitian people is the key to Haitian sustainability.



In 2009 another vision was accomplished by building a a clinic and to bring services such as eye, dental care, prenatal care, and emergency services to northeast Haiti. Today that clinic, Clinique Espérance et Vie, sees 12,000 patients a year. Babies have been born there, surgeries performed, cavities filled, vaccinations administered, and visiting U.S. doctors welcomed. It is truly a clinic of hope and life. In addition to supporting education and health care initiatives, Bethlehem Ministry raises funds to support the efforts of Father Bruno and the NGO as they work tirelessly to provide food and humanitarian aid to the communities of northeast Haiti.



Father Bruno retired from active Parish work in 2010 after a career that blessed him with serving in Haiti as well as the Episcopal Diocese of the Dominican Republic. Today, he lives in Miami FL with his wife and close to family. He still continues to be involved and support Bethlehem Ministries.



OBPC currently sponsors 15 youth for the 2023-2024 school year, and we are beginning to raise funds for the 2024-2025 school year. \$325 will support a child for that year, free medical care at the clinic for them and their family, and a daily hot meal.


