## The Home Visitor

#### **EVERY DAY'S THE FIRST DAY**

Remember the first day of school when you were little? New crayons, new pencils with sharp points, a new notebook with nothing written in it, maybe even some clothes you have never worn before. Then as you get older, that first day of school means there are no grades in the teacher's book yet, no absences, no tardies - it's a nice feeling. Actually, you can have, in a sense, a lifetime of those first days!

I want to have A WORD WITH YOU this month about Every Day's The First Day.

This month's Word comes from Lamentations chapter 3, where we catch the great prophet Jeremiah on an emotional downer. It's Lamentations 3:19-22, "I remember my affliction and my wandering, the bitterness and the gall. I well remember them, and my soul is downcast within me."

Now, Jeremiah's remembering yesterdays with a lot of hardships and failure in them. And then he states, "Yet this I call to mind and, therefore I have HOPE: (there's a change of mood here, huh?) Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness."

I love those words - "God's compassions . . . NEW EVERY MORNING."

Now, what is so positive about that first day of school is that it's a brand new beginning - no marks on your record, a lot of opportunities that are untouched so far - a fresh start. But when God is your Father, **EVERY** day is supposed to be like that - a new beginning. And that's the way you were meant to live, waking up each morning and saying, "This is the day the Lord has made." It's <u>not</u> the weather, <u>not</u> your health/medical condition, <u>not</u> your finances, <u>not</u> your job/boss. "This is the day that the Lord has made. I will rejoice and be glad in it." Yesterday's over, and it can't be changed. Tomorrow's not here yet, so there's no point trying to live tomorrow's challenges today.

God has made this wonderful promise in Deuteronomy 33:25: "Your strength will equal your days." Now, you will never have a day for which God will not provide matching strength. If you're facing a 50-pound day, God will give you 50-pound strength. If tomorrow is going to be a 100-pound day, God will supply you with 100 pounds of strength. But if you try to worry about tomorrow with today's strength, you'll sink. God's emotional, spiritual, and physical resources are measured out in 24-hour injections. So don't try to handle more than today with today's strength.

If you will sincerely confess the sins of yesterday to the Lord, you can start this new day with no marks on your record - with a fresh start-because you invite Christ to be the Lord of that part of you where you have failed in the past. You can wake up looking for a new mission for this day - new matchups between you and people God desires you to influence. And there'll be new resources for this new day, like those new crayons and unused pencils on the first day of school. It's what Jesus called "our daily bread."

Maybe you've been overwhelmed lately because you've forgotten the "dailyness" that you were created to live in. You've been letting too much of yesterday and tomorrow become part of your today. We have this tendency to deal with this huge blob called "my life." Why don't you try just dealing with "my day" instead of "my life?"

When you wake up in the morning, remember that this 24 hours is a unique gift from God. There's never been a day like it before, there never will be another day just like it again. This is why it is said, "Yesterday is history. Tomorrow is a mystery, but Today is the <u>present</u>."

Every day is that first day of school - clean paper, new crayons, sharp pencils, no grades. Allow God to make each new day a fresh new beginning! Prayer is a great way to enter into each day with Jesus.

#### **Morning Prayer**

At the beginning of another day, Father in heaven, it is good to know that You have promised: "My strength will equal my days." I cannot tell what today has in store for me, whether good fortune or misfortune. But I trust Your promise that You will give me the strength to bear whatever this day may bring; that You will make every experience work together for my good and that You Lord will be near me.

I am grateful for the opportunities that this day, with Your blessing, offers to provide the things I need. Teach me, while working for the material things of life, never to forget that my Savior said: "Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well." May spiritual values be first today in all that I think and say and do. Help me firmly to believe that You will give me the material things that You know are best for me.

Keep me faithful and true today to Jesus Christ, and may my conduct glorify Your name. Amen.
