Help us all learn something this [season], that we shall be wise at its close and more ready for our eternal home when we are one step nearer. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

We too can look toward the star and trust that the God of new beginnings will lead us individually, and as a community of faith, forward in faith.

## **CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP, TUESDAY 12/24 AT 5 PM**

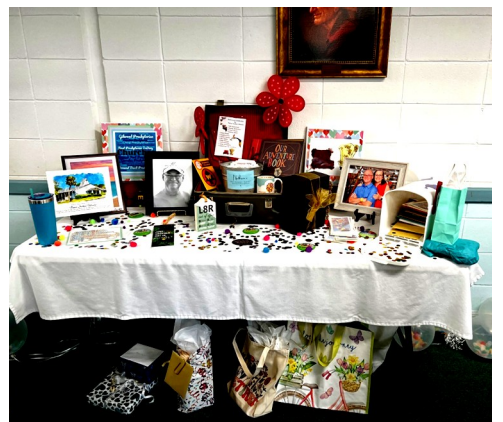
Join us on Christmas Eve,

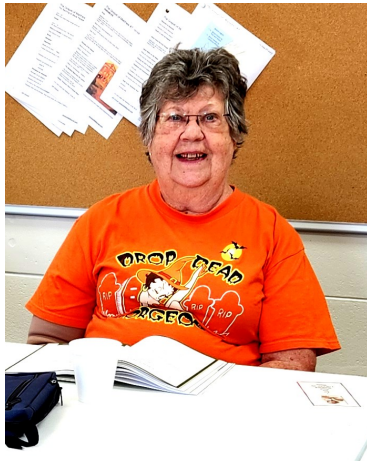

We have enjoyed our Women's Gathering for October and November and are looking forward to our **Christmas Gathering December 7 in Room 12 from 10:00-11:30 a.m.** It's been such a time of joyous fellowship, praise, delicious brunches, raffle prizes, and inspiring video conferences from Women of Faith...Luci Swindoll and Patsy Clairmont. All women are welcome to join us, so don't hesitate to invite a friend. November 2 we were honored to have Christine Johnson as a guest. She will be the Moderator for Presbyterian Pilgrimage 2025. Some of the women who made Pilgrimage last year gave some heartfelt testimonies on how it changed their lives. A highlight of the event was an honor ceremony which included the recitation of "13 Folds of the American Flag" by Bill Thompson. During the reading that describes the significance of each fold, the folding of the flag was presented by Randy Pechin and Chris Stoop. Following a musical rendition of the *Armed Forces Salute*, veterans gathered for a group photo.

Through loose change collected on Communion Sunday, for the [Good Samaritan Fund](#) and [Budgeted yearly financial support](#). Outreach is able to make a difference to individuals locally, nationally and internationally. Please review the work that OBPC was able to accomplish throughout 2024

### Family Renew Community – FRC

Is a non-profit organization who partners with multiple local faith-based organizations. They provide transitional housing and support services for homeless families with children in Volusia County. FRC has “cottages” in Holly Hill, Daytona Beach, and DeLand where families can live for six months or more with no rent or utility payments. They provide case management to help families improve their employment, money management, and parenting skills. Families also learn budgeting and nutrition, and can save toward permanent housing. FRC's goal is to help families achieve permanent housing and self-sufficiency.

- OBPC gives \$100 per month from the [Good Samaritan Fund](#) monthly collection.
- We collect new and gently used household items to be given to the families.
- Church members volunteered their time to decorate three cottage this year with new and donated items to the tenants and give them a comfortable home and new start.

### Habitat for Humanity of Greater Volusia County- HFH of GVC

Is a nonprofit Christian housing organization, which has been serving the area since 1986. Their vision is “a world where everyone has a decent place to live.” Habitat of GVC has built 195 houses with four currently under construction. Groundbreaking for their newest project, Legacy Woods, took place in April 2024. The 6.35-acre development on Flomich St. in Daytona Beach will include 40 units of affordable housing, with eight single-family homes and 16 duplexes.

- OBPC gives \$100 per month from the [Good Samaritan Fund](#) monthly collection.
- Our congregation raised over \$90,000 in a matter of weeks to sponsor a duplex in Legacy Woods.
- Infrastructure has begun on the property in which we will be able to find multiple opportunities to assist making this building a home for a family in 2025.

### Rose Marie Bryon Center – RMBC

An afterschool program located in Daytona Beach. This organization is our longest mission partnership. The Center takes in approximately 25 elementary students Monday through Friday. The children’s time is spent with an afternoon snack, dedicated homework time and, of course, play time. It is completely run by volunteers.

- OBPC gives \$100 per month from the [Good Samaritan Fund](#) monthly collection.
- OBPC gives \$1000 per month for the [Weekend Backpack Program](#). Currently the center provides 50 bags of food to children in need from the center and in the local neighborhood.
- Provides volunteers to read to the children weekly.
- We donated \$1000 to help with repairs to the building after Hurricane Helene.
- The children at the Center participate in our annual Giving Tree project in which our congregation purchases gifts for them during the holiday season.

### **Pace Center for Girls** (Practical Academic Cultural Education)

Is a school-based program that provides support and services for adolescent girls both middle and high school, who are at risk of delinquency. Located in Ormond Beach

- OBPC gives \$100 per month from the *Good Samaritan Fund* monthly collections.
- Provide basic hygiene supplies every couple of months, such as deodorant, mouthwash and hairbrushes that were requested by the school counselors.
- OBPC volunteers created a “baking day” with the students for staff appreciation week. Brownies, frosted sugar cookies and truffles were made and placed in beautifully packaged gift bags for 20 staff members along with hand written *Thank You* notes from the girls.
- We purchased a kitchen workbench along with 4 counter stools to give the students an improved workspace for their cooking projects.
- We decluttered the pantry and cupboards, reorganized and purchased appropriate cooking and baking equipment for future kitchen projects.
- Provided 2nd annual Christmas Holiday Luncheon during their lunch period. Ham, Turkey, Stuffing, Potato Casserole, Vegetables and assortment of baked goods were all served by OPBC volunteers. The girls requested a holiday meal because some of them are unable to experience this during the holidays.

### **Bethlehem Ministry**

An organization located in Athens Georgia that works to improve the quality of life for Haitians through initiatives in education, healthcare, environment, and the economy. The ministry supports Haitians NGO’s that focus on sustainability healthcare and education.

- OBPC gives \$100 per month from an Outreach budgeted account.
- Hosted Rennae Henry, Madame and Rachel who gave an impactful presentation to our church members in January 2024.
- We sponsored 34 students for the 2024-2025 school year at Saint Barthelemy in Terrier-Rouge Haiti.
- Sent donated suitcases, sewing machines, brass wind and woodwind instruments for their school band and surgical instrumentation for cataract surgery all to be delivered by boat out of Miami.

### **Halifax Urban Ministries**

- Collected 337lbs of canned soups for Second Harvest Food Bank during “Souper Bowl” drive.
- Collected 353 lbs of food products during September for National Hunger Action month for Second Harvest Food Bank.
- Collected a grand total of just over 1,400 lbs of food products from our congregation for 2024.

Thank you to all the multiple hands who continue to make the PB&J project such a success! OBPC volunteers weekly make approximately 350 sandwiches every Sunday following worship in the fellowship hall. That makes over 18,000 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches made in 2024 and distributed twice a week to the homeless in Daytona Beach! Please join us.

## Presbyterian Counseling Center

A mission for mental health care by the Presbyterian Church for over 30 years. Services include counseling to individuals, couples and families

- OBPC gives \$166 per month from an Outreach budgeted account.
- The church provides an office space on our church campus 7 days a week.
- Rent and utilities are free.

## Thornwell

A Christian ministry in Clinton SC who provides safe and nurturing environments where professionals educate, equip and support children and families to thrive. "Building Families" program located in Florida, Georgia and South Carolina works with families at the early stages of keeping a family together.

- OBPC gives \$100 per month from an Outreach budgeted account.
- We hosted Joseph Murrey and his family in May 2024. He gave a wonderful presentation regarding the incredible work Thornwell does regarding housing, educating and counseling children in a residential setting on their campus along with launching children into the foster care homes.
- Through extra donations we were able to give Thornwell an extra \$1,500.

## This Child Here

Is a nonprofit group working with vulnerable mothers and youth in Izmail Ukraine. Founded in 2006 by Dr Gamble who was a pastor in Daytona Beach prior to starting this organization. The focus of his organization is to help Ukrainian families, mostly mothers and youth, who have fled their homes due to the Russo-Ukrainian War that started in 2014 with a major escalation in Feb 2022. This Child Here assists the refugees with basic needs such as groceries, clothing and hygiene products. They have a staff available 6 days a week to help the children with homework, learning English, crafts, sports and music. Sunday's are a day set aside for mothers for conversation, crafts and therapy.

- OBPC gives \$100 per month from an Outreach budgeted account.
- In November we hosted Director Dr Gamble and Olya Balabanin Program Manager of This Child Here. They gave a presentation to our congregation along with guests from our community.
- Through extra donations at the presentation we were able to gift \$1,300 to this mission partner.

Incredible work done by an incredible church and congregation!! Please continue to support our Mission Partners in anyway possible so that we are able to make an impact on others' lives.
