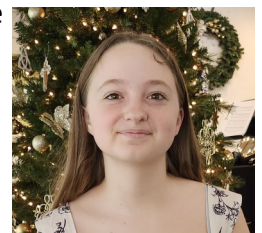

OBPC MISSION PARTNER
BETHLEHEM MINISTRY

The story began in 1985 when founders Peter and Berry Rice first traveled to Haiti to visit their college-aged son, Clai, who was then working for Father Jean Monique Bruno, an Episcopal priest and educator. That journey was the beginning of a deep and committed relationship between the Rice Family and Father Bruno that has lasted almost 40 years and has been the cornerstone of all that has been created since. Upon returning to the U.S. in 1985, Peter and Berry got right to work raising funds to support the educational initiatives of Father Bruno, namely, a school in Limonade, Haiti and a vocational school in Cap-Haitien. In time, Father Bruno's dream of building a school in Terrier Rouge became the primary focus. Peter and Berry decided then that it was time to transition from a small "mom and pop" fundraising group to a 501(c)3 non-profit, and Bethlehem Ministry was born! The name was chosen by Father Bruno. As he explained to Peter and Berry, "Bethlehem means House of Bread, and we are going to be about feeding the poor and hungry. We want to offer the Spiritual Bread to everyone who crosses our path."

Berry's favorite saying, "Dream Big!" became the mantra for many years to follow as Bethlehem Ministry expanded the scope of its outreach. The mission, however - to work in community with Haitians towards Haitian empowerment and sustainability – remained its guiding principle. The outgrowth of this community partnership is a holistic, multi-project approach to addressing the problems of abject poverty in Haiti, namely environmental degradation and lack of access to education, adequate healthcare, and sustainable employment. Today they work in close partnership with a local NGO, *Espérance et Vie*, to oversee 2 main programs: a pre-K through 13th grade school (*Ecole St. Barthélémy*); and a medical clinic (*Clinique Espérance et Vie*), which seeks to meet the health and wellness needs of the local population. Bethlehem Ministry also cooperates and collaborates with another non-profit organization, Partner for People and Place, an income generating, sustainable agricultural project (*Jatrofa Projenou*.)

The Board of Directors consists of people who are dedicated to the mission and are passionate about the work in Haiti. They hope to travel regularly to Terrier Rouge, maintaining close ties there and remaining intimately involved in the ministries they support. Rather than providing only short-term solutions to the crippling effects of poverty and environmental degradation, over the last nearly 40 years Bethlehem Ministry has worked alongside Haitians to build a new foundation for long-term sustainability. Through education, job creation, and access to health care, they are empowering the Haitian people to achieve sustainable independence, to give them a voice in creating their future, and to encourage them to embrace the mantra of our founder and "Dream Big!"

BETHLEHEM MINISTRY IS A CHRISTIAN MINISTRY that

- * demonstrates Christian values as illustrated by the Golden Rule, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you". (Matthew 7:12)
- * respects the Haitian culture through compassionate care, neighborly love, and the honoring of all faiths and traditions of the Haitian people; and
- * provides hope to rural Haitians through a humanitarian effort that includes accessibility to education, healthcare, and employment.
- * provides sustainable solutions that give Haitians the hope and the power to change their lives.

BETHLEHEM MINISTRY HELPS OVERCOME POVERTY through

EDUCATION - St. Barthelemy provides a quality education for children from Pre-K through grade 13. Currently, over 1300 students are receiving biblical teaching and academic training. Over 90% of the students pass their national exam. Many of the graduates go on to higher learning.

HEALTHCARE - Clinique Espérance et Vie, one of the finest medical facilities in Northeast Haiti, provides general medical service, eye and dental care, a pharmacy and lab offerings at little or no cost to those in need. All students who attend St. Barthélémy and their immediate families receive free healthcare at the Clinique.

SUSTAINABILITY - Jatrofa Projenou is a community agriculture and enterprise development center, located in Terrier Rouge, Haiti. It has a Haitian staff, who are skilled in agriculture, forestry, industrial arts, and small business. It contains a farm, a tree nursery, and a light manufacturing and training facility.

HUMANITARIAN AID - Through Espérance et Vie, Bethlehem Ministry is able to provide food, emergency supplies, shelter, clean water, and other humanitarian aid. These emergency measures during times of crisis such as civil unrest, natural disasters, drought, and outbreaks of deadly contagions such as cholera and COVID-19 are life-saving.

WHY IS THE WORK OF BETHLEHEM MINISTRY SO IMPORTANT?

EDUCATION

- 90% of schools are privately funded by religious organizations or NGOs
- 50% of children do not attend school
- An average Haitian has an 8th grade education, even less for females
- Nearly all schools in Haiti require payment to attend

HEALTHCARE

- Life expectancy is 64.4 years
- Haitian government directs just 4.4% of its budget to healthcare
- Haitian government spends \$13/capita on healthcare vs. the US which spends \$10,000
- 30% of the population is food insecure
- 50% of the population has no access to clean water

SUSTAINABILITY

- Poorest western hemisphere country
- 14% unemployment
- 2 of 3 Haitians live on less than \$2 a day
- 50% of Haitians in cities are unemployed
- 80% of the population lives below the poverty line
- Highest deforestation rate in the world
- Crippled agriculture
- Degradation of water sources
- Less than 20% of land is open to agriculture

HUMANITARIAN AID

- 5.2 million Haitians, almost 1/2 of the population, are in need of humanitarian aid
- Approximately 4.9 million Haitians are highly food insecure
- Over 3.4 million Haitians suffer from multidimensional vulnerabilities
