## The Home Visitor

"Will It Float?" by Rev. Dr. Jeff Beebe

With this edition of the Home Visitor, we quickly become aware that change is in the air. We're able to finally leave *the dog days of summer* behind and embrace the newness ahead. For the community of faith, these times provide countless opportunities to look back at what was, as well as look forward, including the boulders which present themselves, or the opportunistic challenges which often loom on our periphery. These times also enable us, as stewards of our gifts, to discern how we have used, or not used, our gifts and equally how we ought now use them as we lean into that which God has called us, or is calling us to be and do.

What is a Steward?

A steward is one who manages or cares for another's property, finances or affairs. God asks us to be stewards of the talents and resources He provides for our life on Earth. How we manage these gifts is an important part of our life and our relationship with God.

Our gifts generally fall into three categories:

**Time** – Time is a precious commodity. A commitment of time is just as important as volunteering a special talent or making a financial donation.

**Talent** – We are each provided with talents that make us unique individuals. Talents such as music, art, public speaking, handiwork, cooking, administration, etc., are gifts that we can share. When we combine our talents, the results are limitless.

**Treasure** – One sixth of Jesus' teaching dealt with how people handle money; being a good steward of one's finances is an important spiritual discipline. The church is like any other organization. It has bills to pay, maintenance that is required, and expenses for personnel and services to fulfill the spiritual needs of the church. Without funding, a church cannot provide for itself and its mission, the community and beyond.

Moving boulders is no small feat and often in meeting challenges on the periphery yet, to these we've been called to reach the least, and the last, and the lost for the Kingdom of God.

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. 1 Peter 4:10


