“By Another Way” Rev. Dr. Jeff Beebe

January is named after Janus, the Roman god of beginnings, endings, and doorways. The month’s name comes from the Latin word Ianuarius, meaning “month of Janus,” as he was depicted with two faces looking in opposite directions – one at the past and one at the future.

That is where we once again find ourselves, individually, and as a community of faith as we watch the New Year’s Eve Ball drop, as we celebrate the ending of one year and welcome the year ahead. As the clock strikes midnight and the world ushers in 2026, people around the world will sing Scottish poet’s Robert Burns 18th-century Scottish ballad *“Auld Lang Syne”* about *“old acquaintance be forgot”* allowing one to reflect fondly on the past as well as the beginning of something new.

Baptism equally looks back at the past as it points to what is ahead as the old life, our old way is no longer and a new life, a new way is begun. I firmly believe that the Biblical account of the Three Kings encounter with the Christ-child changed their lives, in the same way our lives are unmistakably changed, made new, offered a hopeful, peaceful, joyful, and loving newness in Christ. For they, the Wise Men, *having been being warned in a dream not to return to Herod departed to their own country by another way* (Matthew 2:12).

This new way for you and for me is one that begins with what the Advent reminded us of in the Peace, Hope, Joy, and Love that was brought forth by the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit who journeyed with us in our past and promises to guide us into the future, yes, this day and every day.

I Stand by the Door by Sam Shoemaker

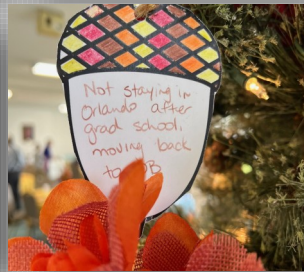
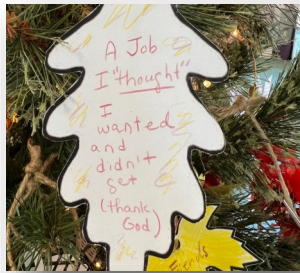
Sam Shoemaker (1893-1963) served as a pastor in New York City and Pittsburgh. He was instrumental in establishing the spiritual foundation for Alcoholics Anonymous, particularly the need to turn to God as a way of coming out of alcoholism. Rev. Shoemaker, toward the end of his life, wrote “I Stand by the Door” as an apology for his ministry. Perhaps this poem will help us understand to that which and to whom we are being called individually and as community of faith.

I stand by the door.
I neither go too far in, nor stay too far out,
The door is the most important door in the world—
It is the door through which people walk when they find God.
There’s no use my going way inside, and staying there,
When so many are still outside, and they, as much as I,
Crave to know where the door is.
And all that so many ever find
Is only the wall where a door ought to be.
They creep along the wall like those who are blind.
With outstretched, groping hands,
Feeling for a door, knowing there must be a door,
Yet they never find it . . .
So I stand by the door.

A wonderful way to get our hearts and minds in the Thanksgiving mindset .

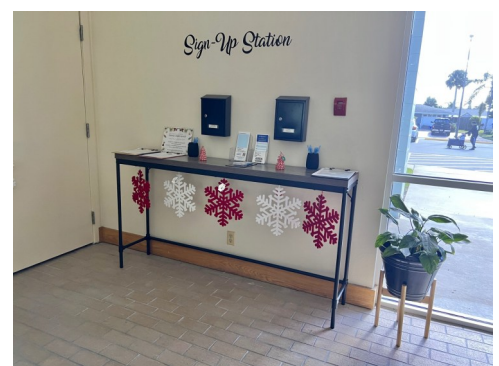

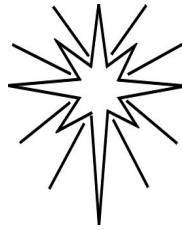


Music Notes—January 2026

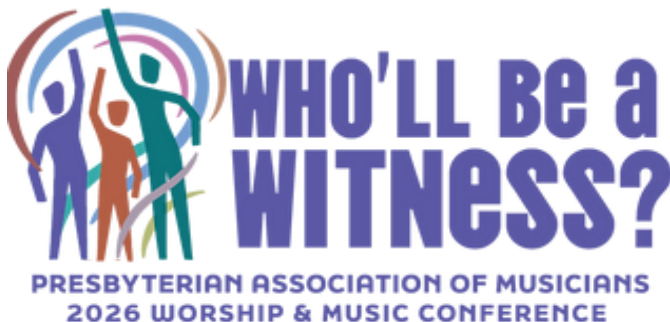

Our family is the greatest joy we know, especially since we were once told we couldn't have children.

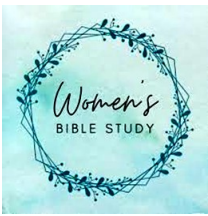

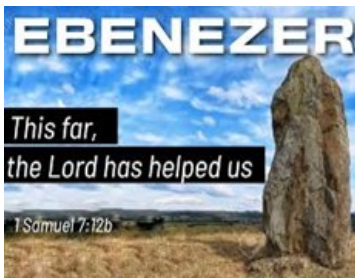

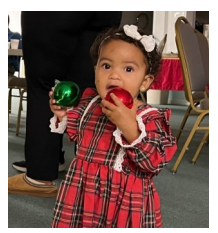


We love our PB&J Brigade.
